How can we offer inclusion if we do not know about those excluded?


How can we offer comfort if we do not know about the pain?

Every year, Davenport takes part in the Shoebox Appeal, originally through Samaritan's Purse, but in recent years, through Teams4U. We have just been informed that there was a total of 64,045 shoeboxes in 2023 compared to 62,574 in 2022. Amazing, given the financial situation here in the UK. The shoeboxes were taken to Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina (BH) and In partnership with the Red Cross, for 4 nights and 5 days, they partook in the distribution of the shoeboxes to understand the current state of the nation and its people.

Our Church Charities

For some twenty years now, in addition to collecting for Church based charities such as Action for Children, Methodist Homes, Christian Aid, Wood Street Mission and World Church, we at Dialstone Lane have chosen a charity to support for a year of fundraising at our AGM.

We alternate between "home" and "away" charities each year and have found it a great way to commit to learning about the work of a particular charity, as well as enjoying ourselves, with the additional purpose of raising money for a good cause.

The charities have ranged from well known development charities such as Practical Action, based on the "Small is Beautiful" principles of E F Schumacher, to much more local charities such as specific units of local hospitals, to which individuals in Church have had cause to be grateful. Dementia care was another very personal concern for church members so we raised funds for two local charities offering different sorts of care. We are running out of window sill space in the Church to display the photographs of twinned toilets!

Last year we chose TWAM (Tools with a Mission), collecting unused tools used in such trades as garage mechanic, joinery, electrician, tailoring and dress-making as well as small scale farming, to be refurbished in this country (by youngsters offered apprenticeships, as well as volunteers) and then shipped to projects in Africa where training is given and people can be equipped to earn their livelihoods.

We have done many types of fundraising too. Our in-house musicians have provided great afternoons and evenings of entertainment as well as visiting choirs. Sponsored runs, family fun days, flower festivals, coffee mornings with lots of extras, an annual Christmas quiz concocted by Andy Stoker with a just giving page attached, beetle drives, chocolate bingo, safari dinners and many other happy social events as well.

A surprise source of funds has been when we've decorated a tree for the St George's Christmas Tree Festival and all the decorations were bought by visitors! They were lovely bright knitted frogs - cuddly toys and keyrings - which we'd adopted as an emblem for our fundraising for Jump Space, which provides trampolining therapy for children with disabilities and their siblings.

This year we are raising funds for two Stockport charities, Charnwood Inclusive Nursery in Heaton Moor and the Olive Branch in Edgeley which offers small groups, mental health support, a foodbank and an outreach service to homeless and hostel dwellers in the local area. On Saturday March 2nd there will be a coffee morning at Dialstone Lane Methodist Church from 10.00 - 1.00, with cake stall, tombola and craft stall. Do come!

Starting at 2.00 p.m., when we are showing the 1975 World War 2 drama **"THE HIDING PLACE" to mark Holocaust Memorial Day (27th January).**

This film is the true story of Corrie Ten Boom and her family, and how their strong Christian faith helped them to counter the Nazi madness when the Netherlands was invaded early in the war. They rescued and sheltered Jews in their house until eventually their work was discovered and they were all arrested. Corrie and her sister Betsie ended up in Ravensbruck concentration camp (where at one point in the film there's a really interesting discussion about God and love). We see the real Corrie at the conclusion of the film talking briefly about her life and faith – in fact she spent the rest of her life going round the world (even Germany) talking about her faith, especially to prisoners.

Cathedral Theological Conversations

THURSDAY 22nd FEBRUARY 7-8.30pm 'Theology and decolonial reading of the texts'

Raj Bharat Patta, is an (im)migrant public Dalit liberation theologian, and a minister at the United Stockport Methodist Circuit. He leads the Stockport Multi-faith Network, serves on the Greater Manchester Faith & Belief Panel of the GMCA and is a member of the Interfaith Theological Advisory Group of the CTBI. He is involved with the Stockport Race and Equality Partnership, with the Belonging Together group of the Methodist Church and with the Asian Theologians Group in the UK. He has pioneered a Telugu Christian Methodist fellowship in Manchester, serving the migrant communities in the region.

His writings include political theological commentaries on contemporary issues using scriptures, creative liberational liturgical resources and multi-faith statements on public issues. His most recent book is 'Subaltern Public Theology: Dalits and the Indian Public Sphere'. Raj Bharat Patta













Woodley Methodist Church - THRIFT SHOP & CAFÉ

The Thrift Shop and Cafe in the old church hall opened its doors on Saturday 18th May 1996 so it has now been going for almost **28** years. Its original purpose was to raise funds towards the building of a new church. When the new Church was officially opened in September 1998 the Thrift Shop had already contributed £33,000 towards the cost.

It became so popular and proved to be such an asset in the community, that it was decided to open on Wednesdays as well. Then and now, it is open due to the total commitment, week after week, by a dedicated group of people who so willingly give their time to running it. As well as raising considerable funds for the church, the Thrift Shop Café has become a meeting place for friends, church members and the wider community. Everyone is welcomed and regular customers are known and cared for by the volunteers. Regular users will all tell you what a great atmosphere there is.

When the old hall was demolished the Thrift Shop moved to its present position underneath the Church Sanctuary. This room was about ¼ of the size of the old hall so the type of goods sold had to be radically reduced, however, it was still so popular it was decided to carry on and the good work continues. The shop was refurbished in 2020 and with the move to advertising and selling online as well as in person, the takings continue to increase.

We run a café alongside the thrift shop which raises money for charities. The Saturday Café raises a considerable amount for Methodist Charities. (£2,455 last year) and the Wednesday Café raises money for National and Local Charities (£1,519 last year).

Everything we sell is clean, good quality and a lot of it new. This is due to the high standards we strive to maintain and the quality of the donations we receive.

All are welcome so please come and visit us any Wednesday or Saturday between 9.30am and 12 noon.

Easter Chick Knitting Pattern

You will need - Any colour of double knitting wool. Needles size 11 (3mm). Cotton wool ball/toy stuffing for the head. Black fet or thread for eyes. Orange felt for beaks. Coloured ribbon. Creme egg (for size fit)

Cast on 20 sts. Knit one row. Inc in 1st stitch, k8, inc. into next 2 sts, knit to end (23sts). Inc in 1st stitch, k9, inc. into next 2 sts, knit to end (26sts). Inc in 1st st, k11, inc. into next 2 sts, knit to end (29sts) Inc 1 stitch at the beginning of every row until 42 sts are on the needle. Cast off 11 sts at the beginning of the next 2 rows (20sts) Inc 1 st at the beginning of the next 4 rows (24sts) Knit 4 rows. K2, then k2tog to last 2 sts. K2 (14sts) Knit 4 rows. K2, then k2tog to last 2 sts, k2 (9sts) Draw wool through the remaining 9 stitches and pull tight. With that piece of wool, sew around the edge of work to the beginning st leaving the cast-on edge open so that the edg can be inserted. Stuff the head with a cotton wool ball, sew it around the neck, gather in. Sew 2 eyes with fine black wool and stick or sew a small diamond shaped piece of orange felt for the beak. Try a few beaks to get it right. Tie a thin piece of ribbon around the neck in a bow.

Insert egg and check it doesn't drop out when held by head. Add extra stitches to tighten if required.







Shrove Tuesday 13th February 2024

Pancake Day



Ingredients

100g plain flour

2 large eggs

300ml milk

1 tbsp sunflower or vegetable oil, plus a little extra for frying

lemon wedges to serve (optional)

caster sugar to serve (optional)

Method

STEP 1

Put 100g plain flour, 2 large eggs, 300ml milk, 1 tbsp sunflower or vegetable oil and a pinch of salt into a bowl or large jug, then whisk to a smooth batter.

STEP 2

Set aside for 30 mins to rest if you have time, or start cooking straight away.

STEP 3

Set a medium frying pan or crêpe pan over a medium heat and carefully wipe it with some oiled kitchen paper.

STEP 4

When hot, cook your pancakes for 1 min on each side until golden, keeping them warm in a low oven as you go.

STEP 5

Serve with lemon wedges and caster sugar, or your favourite filling. Once cold, you can layer the pancakes between baking parchment, then wrap in cling film and freeze for up to 2 months.
