We completed our second annual Bible study course just as Advent began. The sessions are fortnightly via zoom, and the aim is to begin another after Lent! The group has really enjoyed getting to know one other, the discussions, the fellowship and of course, learning more about our Saviour!

The 2023 topic was 'A lineage of grace', featuring Rahab, Tamar, Ruth, Bathsheba and Mary (mother of Jesus), who were the 5 women in Jesus' genealogy.

The 2024 topic was 'Sons of Encouragement', featuring 5 men, who impacted the world in which they lived; the 5 men are: Aaron, Amos, Caleb, Jonathan and Silas.

The material for both of these courses was written by Francine Rivers, who is wonderfully creative. She writes a story around what we know of these characters in the bible, while maintaining the integrity of the scripture; then she imagines some of the conversations and events that we don't know and writes about what might have gone on in-between the lines!

The material for these courses is important to open up conversation; however what is really precious is the level of conversation we have as we discuss these people from our bible. We learn about the cultures, the geography and the history of God's people. Most importantly, we learn about the God who came to earth as a baby to save us!

We talked about what we'd do after Lent in 2025 and we thought it might be good to do something slightly different - possibly around the TV series called 'The Chosen'. We could perhaps watch/listen to an episode at our leisure between sessions and then discuss it together.

Come along to a session to find out more.


Thursday Drop In

Liverpool Plus Mission Area

Threads through the Bible is a breath-taking culmination of ten years' dedication and passion, showcasing three extraordinary exhibitions: Threads through Creation, Threads through the Cross, and Threads through Revelation. Across a stunning display of 38 silk panels, stretching 80 meters and featuring over 25 million intricate stitches, this exhibit is a visual storytelling masterpiece.

The exhibition is at **Liverpool Cathedral** from **16th January to 3rd March**. Admission is **free** and it is open daily from **10am - 6pm**.

Update from Christian Aid:
